

FROM THE OFFICE DOWN THE HALL Sam Delauter, Assistant Superintendent

The September meeting was hosted by Mark Maynard, the owner of the Crusty. It's been a couple of years since we have been able to visit the Crusty so it was nice to visit again and to see what Mark has been up to for the last two years. While it was nice to see the members of the Coal Division, it was also nice to fellowship with our friends from Division 6. On top of visiting the Crusty and visiting with our NMRA members, I got to get a first hand look at Robert Osburn's scratch built coal mine. While it isn't noticeable at first glance, Robert went as far as to modeling the cribbing under the floors and the rafters in the roof. It was really great to get to see this model, you often don't see this kind of quality in N scale. Robert's eye to detail was top notch.

I have not been doing a lot of modeling for the last couple of months. While I would have liked to have spent more time modeling, I just haven't been doing so. This lack of modeling time has come from a combination of work, being busy with the family, and the heat of late summer. Even though I haven't been modeling much, it doesn't mean that I haven't been making progress on projects that I have been working on. Recently I got a brass Erie Lackawanna caboose and an Arrowhead Models PRR hopper ready for weathering.

I picked both of these models up at good prices. While it did have to be painted and decaled, the prototype paint scheme of this era was pretty simple. It had a red car body and roof with black ends and under frame. Part of the under frame is visible from the side, it looks like it has a black band along the bottom of the car. The decals were pretty spartan also, hence these have been called EL spartan scheme. Much like the EL caboose, the Arrowhead hopper was pretty spartan on extra decals. I really only added the ACI plate.

Both of these cars needed new trucks but for different reasons. While the EL did roll well with the factory trucks, I was wary of shorts developing. I have had this happen with other

brass rolling stock before. I swapped the trucks with a set of Atlas caboose trucks. The Arrowhead car rolled well from the factory but the trucks weren't of the proper type. I remedied that with a set of Tahoe Model A3 trucks. These give a much better representation of the trucks used on these hoppers. While they both had different levels of work done to them, even at this reduced amount of work I was able to get them close to completion over the last few weeks.

For this last part of my article, we need to go back to when I was considering joining the Kanawha Valley Railroad Association. It was early, 2017 and I had decided that I would join the KVRA if I were able to find the kits that I needed to model the Erie and if I were capable of building these kits. As I started to research what was available in HO I decided to go ahead and join since I already owned some HO equipment.

Some time within the next year, I started to buy the kits that I needed. In some cases I bought quite a few kits. I think I ended up with nine F&C Erie Stillwell coach kits. Others I bought as few as one. For example, one of these kits was the Bethlehem Car Works Erie C9 Baggage car. Many of our members may remember this car as the wood Erie baggage car that I entered into the contest at Bluefield a couple of years ago. While this kit was quite a challenge to build, I always hoped to have several of these cars. For years now I have been on a search to find at least one more of these kits. I have checked online and called many shops looking for another of these kits. I even spoke with the manufacturer and was unable to find any leads on another kit. Much to my delight, one recently came up on eBay. Although I doubt I'll find another one of these kits, I am happy to have a second one of these cars.

While we are all looking for that rare kit to build or to add to our collections, I hope that this gives you hope of finding yours or that you at least enjoyed hearing about mine. And as always: Be kind to yourself and even better to others



First Place: Tehachapi Loop Photo was taken on July 23, 2021 on an iPhone by Bob Weinheimer.


Second Place: Coal Train meet in Eastern Iowa Photo was taken on May 2016 by Jerry Doyle







