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

FROM THE OFFICE DOWN THE HALL Sam Delauter, Assistant Superintendent

In this column I often write about kits that I am building or other projects that I am working on. I thought this month that would write about my recent day running trains at the Kanawha Valley Railroad Association. I took a few locos and my PRR passenger car fleet to the club to run. I figured I would take these as I wouldn't have to haul a lot of equipment and I could test a couple of locos that I had done some work to.

The second loco that I ran that day was a BLI PRR 2-10-4. This is an older PCM made Broadway model, I got it used at a good price at a train show. This loco ne stant shorting problem. Initially I thought it was the old sound board with a plug and play 8 pin motor decoder. hard wired a basic motor decoder into the loco to try to fix the problem but have still had issues with shorts. Re

I guess the easiest way to sum up my day was that my rolling stock all ran very well. My locos, on the other hand, did not. The first loco that I put on the track was my Broadway Limited PRR T1 duplex. This loco has run well for me for years, I have run it at the club and open houses numerous times. It has always run really well but in the last couple of years the sound has started cutting out at weird times. The loco ran well to begin with but the sound was odd on this day. It wasn't cutting out or anything but it was rather weak sounding. I ran the loco with the sound off and it was running well. That was until it didn't. I saw the loco running and it started to slow down. At speed step 28, it was running at what would have been speed step 4-8. I immediately pulled the loco and could smell a burnt smell from the tender. I opened the tender. The smell was even stronger but I could not find anything that looked burnt. I am not a huge fan of BLI's decoders. I however don't change them unless need be. This loco will sit on the rip track until I get a new decoder for it.

The second loco that I ran that day was a BLI PRR J1 2-10-4. This is an older PCM made Broadway model, I got it used at a good price at a train show. This loco never has run well, actually it has never run at all. It has a constant shorting problem. Initially I thought it was the old sound board with a plug and play 8 pin motor decoder. I hard wired a basic motor decoder into the loco to try to fix the problem but have still had issues with shorts. Recently I opened up the loco and retouched a number of solder joints. Since the loco ran well at home on a test track, I thought that the problem was fixed. The only way to really know was with a test run at the club. Unfortunately the loco is still shorting out. I guess I will have to send this off to get repaired. Maybe I will send this to the people that David Oliverio is having work on some his locos, they seem to do good work.

The final loco that gave me a headache is a Bachmann PRR K4s Pacific. The loco is DCC ready with an 8 pin plug. I plugged in a decoder that I had previously used in another loco in hopes that it would be ready to go. Once on the layout, the loco ran fine until it got track speed. When I tried to slow the speed of the loco down, there was another problem: it did not respond to any command that I gave it. I am not sure what is causing the problem but I may end up trying another decoder to get the loco running.

While I did not have any luck with these locos hopefully if you are having issues with some of your own this column will let you know that you are not alone.

- Adapted substrate to conventional gondolas
- Cut wood substrates to fit various size cars

- Dumped mica chips into glue, pressed in with finger
- After glue dried, trimmed up edges

HO SCALE MODEL RAILROAD AVAILABLE

Past and hopefully future member Steve Lee has a good deal for you: a model railroad free for the taking!

In Steve's words: I have a proposal if anyone in the group or as a whole would be interested:

I have an unfinished 4x13 mountain layout that needs some attention to the right group or person. I will donate this and I trust your discretion on how it should be donated

The layout breaks down into 3 sections. It is fully loaded with track and turnouts. (Walthers) and Cicuitron slow motion switch motors. Fully wired for DC. It will be necessary to cut the track and wiring to break down into 3 sections. In addition the legs come off as well. It is about 40" high to over 6 feet at highest points. More like an L girder structure.

I would need someone to come and help take apart and carry out to wherever it would go, the layout is in Point Pleasant. All bolts are 7/16 nuts and it is put together in such a way that all is labeled for reassembly except the wiring. The track cutting would take the time to put back together but all doable. And, maybe someone will cut it up and use as needed. I have no problem with that idea. I just want it put to good use. I do not want to just throw it out.

I want some group or person to enjoy and finish the layout in anyway they see fit. It originally was a depiction of the Durango and Silverton narrow gauge in Co.

In addition. I'll throw in 3 mrc tech 2 power packs. These were originally used for the layout.

The there is no power or rolling stock included.
