

### FROM THE OFFICE DOWN THE HALL Bill Stowe, Assistant Superintendent

Let me start by simply saying how much I enjoyed the December meeting, and thanking all who participated. This includes Bob Osburn for the modules, Herb Parsons and others who answered questions, all who built modules, and all who brought food on Saturday. And if I missed anyone, just a plain old thanks for being part of the group. It was interesting to see everyone's different approach to the module. There were many good ideas and much great modeling.

For my part, I was pleased with the outcome of my module despite its' rough edges. It is now 'back in the shop'. Plans are to trade out the Majestic Hardware and Feed structure for Shaw's Ridge Equipment (Bar Mills kit) which should fit better in that space. The module also needs some tweaking on scenery and details such as signage. For the Majestic Hardware and Feed structure my

current plan is to finish the model with castings, signage, and maybe some weathering. Beyond that I have some longer term thoughts on how to reuse it.

And now a final note. If you're looking for a relatively simple New Year's resolution think about taking a moment to sign in to the NMRA website and having a look around at the content. Based on some of Bob Weinheimer's comments it sounds like changes are coming to enhance its use, and I see constant promotion of its content in the monthly NMRA magazine. I encourage folks to sign in now so we can resolve any issues with access including user name, password, etc. I would be glad to help if any struggle with accessing the site. To 'practice what I preach' I used the website to renew my membership with no issues at all.

#### Passenger Manifest John Harris, Membership Chair

It is hard to believe that I actually wrote 2025 as part of the title for this article. While you will not see it per se, it will be in the date for the newsletter and it will be 2025 when you read this. It is difficult for me to wrap my head around how quickly 2024 passed by. I look back at the goals I set for myself for the year, particularly the ones I made regarding the Alleghany & New River Road, and I ask "what happened"? The year just started. I have plenty of time to get more things done. but here we are looking squarely at 2025 and few of those goals have been completed. Sure, a few things were done and several structures and nearly complete. I few more cars have been assembled and weathered, and even a purchase or two was made. But largely I will start 2025 with virtually the exact same list of things to do. I suspect there are a few others that might feel the same way. Still, I am impressed with those who have made significant progress on their railroads over the past year. A few even have certificates attesting to the progress made. Congratulations to all of you. May this year bring several of us closer to our goals.

Last month's Challenge was particularly satisfying. First, it allowed me to try something new. While the techniques, of course, were similar to what I normally do, the scale was a bit more of a challenge. Secondly, the fact that so many took advantage of the opportunity to enter into the world that is T-TRAK. While some took a more basic approach, there is still a foundation to add scenery and expand on what has been started. As expected others were a little more aggressive in adding scenery, buildings, and even lighting but the end result was a fully operational layout that required little tweaking to make trains run in both directions with only minor hiccups.

As I have stated before, I am excited about the ability

for the Coal Division to now take so many new modules and add them to those already completed to make a very impressive layout. This, I believe, will be a great promotional tool for the Division at the next and future train shows. I suspect that as a recruitment tool, potential newbies to the hobby that are not ready to start their own layout might see T-TRAK as a way of getting their feet wet in the hobby without a major commitment to space or dollars. And what better way to get into the hobby than to have one of our members talking to them about the benefits of NMRA joining thru a "Rail Pass" membership?

With the February show with KVMRA coming up shortly, I plan to get some of the newly or soon to be published promotional materials that Bob Weinheimer has been telling us about. This should help tremendously when telling the story of the benefits of NMRA membership. This combined with some "how to" demonstrations and having T-TRAK next to us may be a compelling recruitment opportunity.

I will have a sign-up sheet at the January and the February meetings for anyone interested in taking a turn at manning the Division Display. I will also include space on the sheet for volunteers that plan on providing a demonstration during their time at the booth. I am planning to assemble and weather a craftsman kit while manning the booth and I encourage others to consider doing the same. It is a good way to start a conversation promoting the hobby and it helps to pass the time. Besides, it may help you get closer to one of those goals you have for your layout in 2025.

Keep modeling and I hope to see you at the January meeting.





Of particular note is that Randy, as we should all know, uses locomotives that receive their power from batteries, not the rails. The usual electrical work therefore does not apply. Even so, Randy cheerfully did a few of the things required for the certificate including wiring up a temporary bit of track to show he can do it. His layout does not contain all the required elements for the civil certificate so he built some temporary track to cover that

as well. Keep that in mind in case a similar issue is stalling your progress.


With two members earning their MMR®s this past year, there is yet one more member who is very close to that goal. All I need to do is to inspire him to step out his comfort zone to complete the job.
