



FROM THE OFFICE DOWN THE HALL Bill Stowe, Assistant Superintendent

Well, I hope everyone has managed to survive our heat wave along with the associated thunderstorms. My month has been spent trying to do outdoor chores in the morning, and then most of the afternoon inside where it is cool. It has been a chance for delayed spring cleaning inside along with some modelling time.

I've been making some progress with my latest structure kit. It is an HO structure from FOS models, the Sarno Woodworking kit. I'd rate FOS models as similar to the Bar Mills kits and would say it falls into the craftsman kits arena. I'm thoroughly enjoying the build. Like many of the Bar Mills it is a unique structure layout. I'd say the instructions are better than Bar Mills, although a lot of

reliance on the modeler's experience is necessary. Quality of parts is good. This kit has some unique features which I have not experienced before. One portion of the building is card stock braced inside with 1/8 inch stock, and the outside to be covered in '2 x 10' vertical planks. They also refer to other stock as 2 x 4, 2x6, so it has been interesting trying to sort all the parts. The only fault I would give the kit is they provide the bare minimum of wood stock for the construction, so you need to plan cuts accordingly or have a backup supply. I had hoped to have it ready for the July meeting structure contest, but that's not going to happen.

T-TRAK Herb Parsons, T-TRAK Chair

I do not have any thing about T-TRAK this month, so I thought I would write a short history of T-TRAK.

In July of 2000, the Japan Association of Model Railroaders invited Jim Fitzgerald to speak at their annual convention. Mr. Fitzgerald, the founder of the NTRAK Newsletter for the modular NTRAK system of modules, accepted the invitation and he and his wife, Lee Monaco-Fitzgerald, went to Japan in August 2000. While there, he saw the Hino N Club layout of 12"X12" modules using a 2-track mainline and Kato Unitrack.

In March 2001, Lee started writing articles for the NTRAK Newsletter concerning attracting new people to the model railroad hobby. The articles had ideas to try to interest people while they were at train shows or at open houses for clubs.

In the July 2001 newsletter, Lee published photos of the Japanese modelers and the Hino Club modules. The September 2001 issue introduced the T-TRAK modules for the first time. The modules were based on the Tram modules designed by RM Models of Japan. The concept pulled all the topics Lee had been writing about together: table top modules, Kato track, and getting new modelers

into the hobby.

The first three T-TRAK modules were built by Lee and displayed on the NTRAK layout at the Gateway 2001 National Convention and Train Show in St. Louis, MO. in July 2001.

In the May 2002 NTRAK Newsletter was the inauguration of a regular T-TRAK column. The article featured the double modules made by Paul Musselman.

The Capitol Limited 2004 convention in Chantilly, Virginia had the first full layout for T-TRAK modules with 114 feet of modules. There has been a T-TRAK layout at every convention since.

I would like to remind everyone that in 2026 at the convention in Chattanooga, TN there will be the largest T -TRAK layout with over 1400 modules filling the available space. committed and many more on standby in case of no shows.

I got this info from the Nrail web site where they have a full history of not only T-TRAK and photos of the first modules by Lee and the Hino N Club, but also a history of NTRAK.








Under Construction
